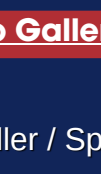
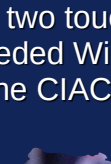




# CLASS MM



**WINDSOR 23**



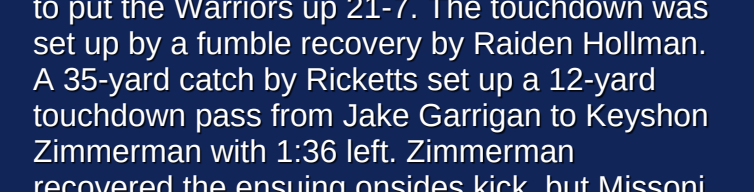

NEW BRITAIN, Dec. 13, 2025 – AJ Robinson ran for two touchdowns and threw for another as top-seeded Windsor defeated No. 3 Bunnell 23-13 in the CIAC Class MM title game.

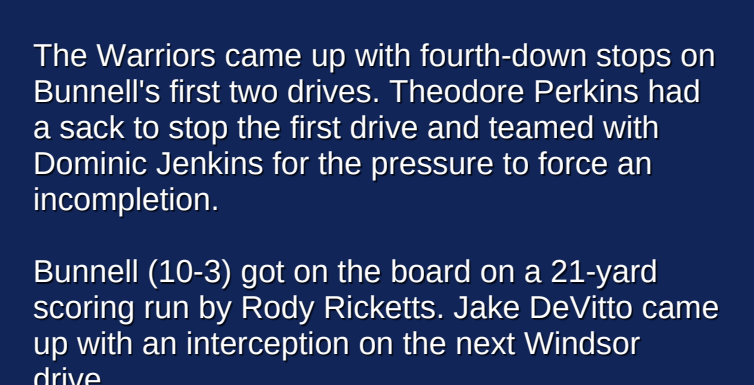


Robinson scored from 5 yards out with 4:20 left to put the Warriors up 21-7. The touchdown was set up by a fumble recovery by Raiden Hollman. A 35-yard catch by Ricketts set up a 12-yard touchdown pass from Jake Garrigan to Keyshon Zimmerman with 1:36 left. Zimmerman recovered the ensuing onside kick, but Missoni Brown had an interception two plays later.

Bunnell got one last chance, but Hollman tackled Bunnell quarterback Jake Garrigan in the end zone with seven seconds left.

"We put it all on the line today and we got it done," said Robinson, who was 13 of 23 for 140 passing yards and added 99 rushing yards. "The defense played amazing, they kept us in the game. The offense was a little shaky, but we trusted our guys to make plays and they did."

Windsor (12-1) scored on its first two drives. Robinson, the Connecticut Gatorade Player of the Year, had a 6-yard scoring run and a 4-yard touchdown pass to Brown.



The Warriors came up with fourth-down stops on Bunnell's first two drives. Theodore Perkins had a sack to stop the first drive and teamed with Dominic Jenkins for the pressure to force an incompletion.

Bunnell (10-3) got on the board on a 21-yard scoring run by Rody Ricketts. Jake DeVitto came up with an interception on the next Windsor drive.



"It was a heck of a game when you are playing the Gatorade Player of the Year and two great receivers like that, we had to come and battle," Bunnell coach Ty Jenkins said. "We are proud of the way our guys responded and we knew they weren't going to go away."

"This group is amazing. What they have done is incredible. In a two-school town where talent is split with no feeder system into our program, just to stay together with the numbers that we had, upset the No. 3 team in the state to get here and only lose to top-tier teams, this senior class is amazing and will never be forgotten."
